

Hailey was drawn to Bucknell because of its expansive approach to literary studies. "Most other schools just have English with an aim toward a profession in education. Here, I can explore aspects of the field that really interest me, like publishing and editing," she says. She's currently honing those skills through an internship with West Branch, a professional literary magazine published by Bucknell's Stadler Center for Poetry & Literary Arts. In her free time, you'll usually find her reading fantasy novels. That passion has led her to write an honors thesis about diversity in fairy tale retellings in young adult literature. "Some of the same stories still resonate with us, even centuries later. The one thing that constantly remains in our society is our need for stories."



### MANAGEMENT & ORGANIZATIONS JERIMAHA MCCLAIN '26

Jerimaha signed up for Bucknell's Taste, Tech & Teamwork Pre-Orientation program in Charlotte, N.C., because it sounded like fun. Little did he know the experience would serve as a launching pad for an internship — thanks to a connection Jerimaha made with an alum during the trip. After meeting the chief brand officer of Krispy Kreme, Dave Skena '92, Jerimaha reached out about opportunities with the company. Skena put in a personal recommendation for him, resulting in a global operations internship at Krispy Kreme. Jerimaha spent a summer learning about shop design, improving training systems, and managing limited-time offer processes and ingredient orders across all U.S. locations. "The opportunity to network as a student so early on is huge," he says.



### BIOMEDICAL ENGINEERING ELIZABETH MALLEY '26

Elizabeth aspires to become a physician in pediatric orthopedics, a passion she discovered after breaking her leg — twice. "I realized that the quality of care can vary with public health," she says. Now, Elizabeth is gaining hands-on medical experience as a student researcher in a professor's biomedical engineering lab. The project: investigating the healing effect of ultrasounds on chronic wounds. Elizabeth uses techniques, such as polymerase chain reaction and enzyme-linked immunosorbent assay, to analyze the interactions between ultrasound and the key cell types involved in the wound healing process. "I feel like I'm working toward a big goal," she says. "Compared to a larger school, I think we get very unique learning experiences at Bucknell."

### QUESTIONS TO ASK COLLEGE COUNSELORS:

### What makes your college different from other schools of a similar size or type?

Why it matters: This helps students understand a college's unique strengths, culture or programs beyond what's on the website — especially when comparing similar schools.

### What kind of academic support do you offer for students who are adjusting to college-level work?

Why it matters: Transitioning to college academics can be tough. This question gives insight into tutoring, writing centers and advising services that can help students thrive.

### Can you tell me about the campus community — what do students do for fun, and what's the general vibe like?

Why it matters: Fit isn't just about academics — it's also about social life and student culture. This helps students imagine what their day-to-day life might feel like.

### What kind of internships or real-world experiences do students have access to?

Why it matters: College is a stepping stone to careers. Knowing how a school connects students to hands-on learning, internships or research helps clarify future opportunities.

### How easy is it to change your major or explore different academic interests?

Why it matters: Many students aren't 100% sure what they want to study. This question helps them understand how flexible the curriculum is and whether the school supports academic exploration.











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
